RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed, to pay to Thomas Thompson, of Dorchester county, an old soldier, or his order, during life, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a compensation for his services in the late revolutionary war.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised and directed, to pay unto Basil Burgess, (an officer in the revolutionary war) or to his order, annually, in quarterly payments, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a lieutenant, during his life, as a further remuneration for those services rendered his country during her struggle for independence.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed, to pay to William Davis, late a soldier in the revolutionary war, or to his order, annually, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further remuneration to him for those services by which his country has been so essentially benefitted.

Passed Jan 27 1817 of Lawrence Hurdle

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore of Maryland pay to Lawrence Hurdle, or his order, annually, in quarter yearly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a sergeant, as a further remuneration for those services by which his country has been so essentially benefitted.

Passed Jan 27 1817 Simpson

Resolved, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed, to pay to Lawrence Simpson, of Charles county, (an old revolutionary soldier) or to his order, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private soldier, annually, in quarterly payments, as a further remuneration for his services in the revolutionary war.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to of Allen Town- Allen Townsend, or his order, annually, in quarter yearly payend ments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further remuneration for those services by which his country has been so essentially benefitted.

Passed Jan 27 1817 of Solomon Summers.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed, to pay unto Solomon Summers, of Queen-Anne's county, late a drummer in the revolutionary war, or to his order, during life, annually, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a drummer, as a further remuneration for his services in the revolutionary war.
