RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed and required, to pay to William Layman, or his order, annually, during life, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a lieutenant, as a further remuneration to him for military services.

Passed Jan 27 1817
— of Nathan Griff-

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed, to pay to Nathan Griffin, of Dorchester county, an old soldier, or his order, annually, during life, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a compensation for his services in the late revolutionary war.

No. 36.

Passed Jan 27 1817
— of Robert
Bruce

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised and required, to pay to Robert Bruce, (an old revolutionary soldier) or to his order, during his life, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, in quarterly payments, out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, as a further recompense for his meritorious services during the revolutionary war.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed, to pay unto John Bennett, an old soldier, in the revolutionary war, or to his order, annually, in quarterly payments, during life, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as a further compensation for his services in the revolutionary war.

Passed Jan 27 1817
— of Richard
Bidwell

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to Richard Bidwell, of the city of Baltimore, an old soldier, annually, in quarterly payments, during life, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, as further compensation for his services during the revolutionary war.

No. 39.

Passed Jan 27 1817
— of Henry Leek

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby directed, to pay to Henry Leek, of Montgomery county, an old revolutionary soldier, or to his order, annually, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a sergeant, during his life, as a compensation to him for his services during the revolutionary war.

No. 40.

Passed Jan 27 1817
— of John J. Ja-
cobs

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby directed, to pay to John J. Jacobs, an officer of the Maryland line in the revolutionary war, such sum of money in addition to what he now receives under a resolution passed November session 1811, as will make his pension amount to a sum equal to the half pay of a first lieutenant, during life, in quarterly payments.

RESOLVED. That the governor and council be and they are here- by authorised and required, to appoint two able, intelligent, and judicious persons, as commissioners on the part of this state, to
