**RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby directed, to pay to the official members of the Methodist Church in Annapolis, or to their order, the sum of two hundred pounds, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to enable them to reserve seats in the new meeting house in the aforesaid city, for the accommodation of the members of the executive, legislature, and judiciary of the state.

**RESOLVED**, That the treasurer of the western shore be and he is hereby authorised and required, to pay unto James Hood, of Anne-Arundel county, or his order, annually, in quarterly payments, during his life, a sum of money equal to the half pay of assistant commissary, for his services during the revolutionary war.
