4. **AND BE IT ENACTED,** That all deeds, and other instruments of writing, which have been received within the time limited by law by the several clerks in the several counties, since the passing of the said act, and which shall be received, (until other provision shall be made by law,) shall be recorded, and shall be of the same validity in law, to every intent and purpose, as deeds received and recorded previous to the passage of said act. Deeds, &c. received by county clerks to be recorded, &c.

CHAP. XI.

An Act for the more effectual preservation of the Breed of Wild Deer in Somerset County. Lib. TH. No. 1, fol. 11. Passed Jan 25 1805

The act of 1800, ch. 16, repealed the act of 1799, ch 18, and revived that of 1789, ch. 5, so far as it related to Somerset county. This act, having repealed the act of 1789, ch 5, for the term of three years, so far as respected the above county, was repealed by 1807, ch. 77.

CHAP. XII.

An Act to enable James Walker, John Sprigg Belt and Archibald Dorsey, to complete the Collection of the County Tax in certain Districts in Anne-Arundel County. Lib. TH. No. 1, fol. 12. Passed Jan 25 1805

CHAP. XIII.

An Act authorising James Hackett, and others, Securities of James R. Pratt, late Sheriff, and John B. Hackett and Richard E. Harrison, late Collectors, of Queen-Anne's County, to complete the Collection of the money due the said Sheriff and Collectors. Lib. TH. No. 1, fol. 13. Passed Jan 25 1805

CHAP. XIV.

An Act confirming the title of Ignatius Davis to the Land therein mentioned. Lib. TH. No. 1, fol. 15. A Private Act. Passed Jan 25 1805

His title made valid to the land called Good Luck, lying in Frederick county, conveyed to him by Anthony Paultney, and others.

CHAP. XV.

A Supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate Companies to make several Turnpike Roads through Baltimore County, and for other purposes.* Lib. TH. No. 1, fol. 16. Passed Jan 24 1804 *1804, ch. 51.

WHEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, that in pursuance of the powers vested in the commissioners of the Baltimore and Reister's-town turnpike road by the act to which this is a supplement, that they have opened subscription books, and that there has been subscribed the amount of the capital stock authorised by said act on said road, and they have petitioned that they may be permitted immediately to commence turnpiking the same; and this assembly being of opinion that their prayer is reasonable, therefore,

2. **BE IT ENACTED,** by the General Assembly of Maryland, That so much of an act,† entitled, An act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes, as restrains the president and managers of the Baltimore and Reister's-town turnpike road from commencing their work on said road until the first day of January, eighteen hundred Part of an act repealed. †1804, ch. 51.
