CHAP, XCVIII,

BE IT ENAUTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That torobe assembly from and after the passage of this act, it shall and may be tawful for the levy court of Baltimore county, and they are hereby authorised, directed and empowered, to fix the salary of the inspector pr inspectors of the warehouse or warehouses which have been or shall be established in the city of Baltimore, agreeably to the prowisions of the act passed at November session, eighteen hundred and three.

CHAP. XCIX.

WHEREAS the commissioners heretofove appointed to preserve Preumble and make sale of confiscated British property within this state, have, in many instances, executed deeds of conveyance to the purchasers of such property, or their assignees, for lands sold by the said commissioners as aforesaid, which deeds have been inoperative; therefore.

2. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the chancellor shall be and he is hereby authorised and required. when on application of any person holding or claiming lands in virtue of mer deed of the said commissioners, and on receiving satisfactory most that such claimant has an equitable title to the lands claimed princid by him, to execute a deed, in the name of the state of Maryland, to such claimant, his heirs and assigns, for the lands to which he is so entitled, and such deed, when recorded among the land records of the county wherein such lands lie shall be sufficient effectually to transfer all the right, title and claim, of any Britich subject, to such lands, or which became vested in this state by eny per of assembly heretofore passed.
