CHAP. XXXVII.

CHAP. 37.

An Act to pay the Civil List, and other expenses of Civil Government. Lib. TH. No. 1, fol. 232.

Passed Jan 3, 1807.

Preamble.

WHEREAS those who dedicate their time, abilities and labour, to the public, ought to receive a reasonable and adequate compensation for their services,

Officers salaries:

2. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the following officers of civil government for the time being shall be entitled to receive at the rate of the following salaries, in current money, for the ensuing year, to wit: The treasurer of the western shore, two thousand dollars; the treasurer of the eastern shore, four hundred and fifty dollars; the auditor, eight hundred dollars; the clerk of the council, eight hundred dollars; the clerk of the senate, one hundred and fifty dollars; the clerk of the house of delegates, three hundred dollars; the printer to the state, twelve hundred dollars; the messenger to the council, two hundred and fifty dollars.

3. AND BE IT ENACTED, That all monies which shall remain in the treasury, after discharging the journal of accounts, and all unappropriated money which may come into the treasury, be first applied to the payment of the civil list for the ensuing year.

CHAP. XXXVIII.

An Act to provide for recording and transcribing certain Records and Papers in the Register's Office of Prince-George's County. Lib. TH. No. 1, fol. 233.

Passed Jan 3, 1807.

WHEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, that certain records and papers appertaining to the estates of deceased persons, require transcribing and recording in the register's office of Prince-George's county, and that said records and papers are liable to be damaged and lost; therefore,

Preamble.

2. BE IT ENACTED; by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall and may be lawful for the justices of the orphans court of Prince-George's county, and they are hereby empowered and required, to cause to be transcribed and recorded by the register of wills of said county, in good leather bound books, to which fair and regular alphabets shall be prefixed, such records, and all such papers filed in the office of the register of wills of said county, as they, or a majority of them, in their judgment, may deem necessary and proper to be transcribed and recorded.

Records, &c. to be transcrib. d.

3. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said register shall receive the same fees for his said services as he is by law entitled to for services of a similar nature.

Register's fees.

4. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the levy court of Prince-George's county shall levy, on the assessable property of said county, such sum of money as the fees for recording and transcribing said records and other papers may amount to, to be collected and paid over by the collector of said county to the register aforesaid.

Levy for recording the same.

5. AND BE IT ENACTED, That this act shall continue in force until the first day of March, eighteen hundred and ten, and no longer.

Duration.

Further continued by November 1809, ch. 172, and other annual general continuing acts.
