Myers, Frederick C. Hass, Bernard Gilbert, Abraham Crapster, CHAP. 16. Conrad Shafer, Blie Philips and Frederick Eichelberger, or such majority of them as shall undertake act under this act, shall, before the safe or disposal of any tick or tickets in said lottery, give their bond to the state of Maryland, in the penalty of twenty thousand dollars, conditioned, that they will well and truly apply so much money arising therefrom, within twelve months after the drawing of said lottery shall commence, as will satisfy the fortunate adventurers for prizes drawn by them, and after deducting the necessary expenses incurred in said lottery, shall, within two years from the time the drawing said lottery shall commence, apply the money raised by said lottery for the purpose of building the bridge aforesaid.

S. AND BE IT ENACTED, That it shall be the duty of the said Bond to be lodged in clerk's office. commissioners, or a majority of them, before they act as such, to lodge the bond made, and entered into as aforesaid, in the office of the clerk of Frederick county court, there to be recorded, and upon such bond, or any office copy thereof, suit or suits may be instituted against the obligors therein mentioned, or any of them, or their least representatives, for any breach or non-compliance with the condition of the same.

CHAP. XVII.

An Act authorising delottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose Passed Jan 15 1808 offinishing the Steeple of Saint-John's Church in Elizabeth-Town, in Washington County, and for other purposes. Lib. TH. No. 1, fol. 313.

A Supplement, 1808, ch. 28. WHEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, by the per Preamble. tition of sundry inhabitants of Washington county, that they commenced building a church in Elizabeth-town, in Washington county aforesaid, and that they have finished the said church, except a part of the steeple, but in going thus far with it they have contracted a debt which, with the sum necessary for finishing the said steeple, will amount to two thousand dollars, and praying that a law may pass authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose aforesaid; and the prayer thereof appearing reasonable, therefore.

2. BE IT ENAUTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Schemes may be it shall and may be lawful for George Nigh, Jacob Young, George be given. Schenk, Frederick Otter, Peter Miller, (Hatter) Anthony Hower and John Kausler, or a majority of them, to propose a scheme or scames of a lottery for raising a sum of money, not exceeding two thousand dollars, and sell and dispose of the tickets in said lottery, and they are hereby authorised to draw said lottery; provided, that the said George Nigh, Jacob Young, George Schenk. Frederick Alter, Peter Miller, (Hatter,) Anthony Hower and John Kausler, or such majority of them as shall undertake to act under this law, shall, before the sale or disposal of any ticket or tickets in said lottery, give their bond to the state of Maryland, in the penalty of eight thousand dollars, conditioned, that they will well and truly apply so much money arising therefrom, within six months after the drawing of said lottery, as will satisfy the fortunate adventurers for prizes drawn by them, and after deducting the necessary
