CHAP. 118. 3. AND BE IT ENACTED, That before the said Major Robert Morgan, Alexander Rigdon, Parker H. Lee, John Ashmore, Ed-Bond to be given, ward Prigg, Abraham Jarrett, Zacclicus O. Bond, Thomas Scarborough and Thomas S. Chew, proceed to make sale of any ticket or tickets in the said lottery, they shall give and execute a bond to the state of Maryland, in the penalty of eight thousand dollars. conditioned that they will well and truly conduct the drawing of said lottery, and apply the money arising therefrom, within six months after the drawing thereof, to the payment of the prizes drawn therein to the adventurers to whom they shall be due, and the necessary expenses incurred in the management thereof, and the residue to the repairing of said buildings.

Bond to be record.

4. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said bond shall be lodged in the office of the clerk of Harford county, to be there recorded, and upon such bond, or any office copy thereof, suit or suits may be instituted for any breach or non-compliance with the condition thereof.

Whereas by an act,* entitled, A further supplement to an act to straighten part of the road in Harford county which leads from Underhill's mill to the city of Baltimore, certain commissioners were appointed to review a part of the aforesaid road as therein stated, with power to straighten the same in such manner and in such places as they shall think right: And whereas it is represented to this general assembly, by the petition of a number of the inhabitants of Harford county aforesaid, that the said road has been straightened and laid out through a certain tract of land for which unreasonable damages have been assessed, and the public if any very little benefitted thereby, and praying that the said law may be repeated, and that other commissioners may be appointed to review again and lay out said road; and the prayer being reasonable, and the road of great public utility, therefore,

Commissioners view a road.

2. BE IT ENACTED. by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Thomas M.Kinnon, Josiah Johnson, William Pyle, Joshua Rutledge and Jacob Gladden, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners of review, to review the road leading from Underfull's mill to the city of Baltimore, beginning at a place known by the name of Sandy Bottom, and they, or a majority of them, be and they are hereby authorised to review, lay out and survey, mark and bound, the said road from the place aforesaid to the Rock Ford on the Little Falls of Gunpowder, and shall return a plot thereof to the clerk's office of said county, to be there recorded; Provided, that the said road shall not be laid through the yard, garden or orchard, of any person, without their consent,
