CHAP. CXLIV.

*A Further Supplement to the act\*, entitled, An act to incorporate Companies to make several Turnpike Roads through Baltimore County, and for other purposes. Lib. TH. No. 1, fol. 481.* Passed Jan 20 1803

WHEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, that in pursuance of the powers vested in the commissioners of the Baltimore and York-town turnpike road, by the act to which this is a further supplement, that they have opened subscription books, and there has been subscribed the amount of the capital stock authorised by said act on said road, and they have petitioned that they may be permitted immediately to commence turnpiking the same; and this assembly being of opinion that their prayer is reasonable, therefore, Preamble.

2. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That so much of the act, † entitled, An act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes, as restrain the president and managers of the Baltimore and York town turnpike road from commencing their work on said road until the first day of January, eighteen hundred and eight, or that is anywise inconsistent with this act, shall be and is hereby repealed. 3. AND BE IT ENACTED, That it shall and may be lawful for the commissioners mentioned in said act to which this is a further supplement, or a majority of them, and they are hereby required and empowered, to hold their first election for president, managers and treasurer, on the sixteenth day of January next, under the regulations and restrictions, and to be conducted in the same manner, prescribed in the act to which this is a further supplement. First election for president, &c. when to be held.

4. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the proceedings of the said commissioners in taking the subscriptions aforesaid, be and they are hereby confirmed, and declared to be as binding on the subscribers as though they had been made on the day or days prescribed by the aforesaid act. Proceedings in taking subscriptions confirmed.

CHAP. CXLV.

*An Act for incorporating a Society to educate and maintain Poor Orphan and other destitute Female Children, by the name of The Orphanine Charity School, and to repeal the Act of Assembly therein mentioned. Lib. TH. No. 1, fol. 482.* Passed Jan 20 1803

WHEREAS it appears to this general assembly, that at November session, eighteen hundred and one †, a society was incorporated for the education and maintenance of poor female children, under the style of The Trustees of the Female Humane Association Charity School, in the charter whereof certain defects have been discovered, to the remedy of which all the parties concerned have signified their assent; therefore, Preamble.
