13. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the president and each director, before he enters upon the duties of his office, shall take the following oath, or affirmation, as the case may be: "I do solemnly swear, or affirm, that I will impartially, faithfully, diligently and honestly, execute the duties of —, conformably to the constitution or articles of association of the same, and the trusts reposed in me, to the best of my skill and judgment;" and the clerks, book-keepers and other officers, shall also take a similar oath, or affirmation, and shall besides give bond, with security, to the satisfaction of the president and directors, for the faithful discharge of their duties in their respective stations.

BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the period of time allowed to the stockholders of the Baltimore and Reister's-town turnpike company for agreeing to the extension of the road mentioned in the act passed at November session, eighteen hundred and five†, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes, be and the same is hereby extended for the term of three years after the expiration of the period aforesaid, which is prescribed in the said act.
