sonable, for the purpose of opening and clearing the aforesaid CHAP. 55. road, and the same shall be deemed thereafter a public road, and kept in repair as other public roads in said county are kept in repair.

4. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the said commissioners shall be commissioners entitled to receive as a compensation the sum of two dollars for compensation. each and every day they shall attend in discharge of the duties required of them by this act.

5. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the damages, if any, sustained Damages to be asby the individuals over whose land the said road herein directed to certained. be laid out and straightened may run, shall be ascertained according to the provisions contained in the eleventh section of an act*, * 1791, ch. 70. entitled, An act to straighten and amend the public roads in Harford county, and for other purposes, and the same, when ascertained in manner aforesaid, shall be levied, collected and paid, as other county charges are levied, collected and paid.

CHAP. LVI.

An Act to empower the Inhabitants of the Town of Havre-de-Grace Passed Jan. 6, 1810 to elect the Commissioners thereof. Lib. TH. No. 2, fol. 198.

1. BE IT ENACTED, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Inhabitants to all the inhabitants of the town of Havre-de-Grace, entitled by law appoint commissions and the inhabitants of the town of Havre-de-Grace, entitled by law appoint commissions. to vote for delegates to the general assembly, shall meet in said town, at such place as may hereafter be appointed, and elect by ballot five sensible, wise and discreet persons, to act as commissioners of the town, who, when elected as herein prescribed, shall have the same powers as are by law conferred on the present commissioners.

2. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the commissioners of the town of Meeting of the people to be called Havre-de-Grace shall call a meeting of the people of said town on to choose judges the first Monday in April next(a), by notice of the time and place, set up at three of the most public places in the town five days previous to said meeting, who, when thus assembled, shall choose three discreet persons to act as judges to hold an election in pursuance of this law, and the judges thus appointed shall conduct the same conformably to the regulations prescribed by the act to reduce into one the several acts of assembly respecting elections, and to regulate the same, passed at November session, eighteen hundred and fivet.

(a) By 1811, ch. 21, the people are to assemble on the first Monday in January annually, and appoint judges, who are to hold an election for commissioners.

3. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the clerk of the commissioners Ballot box to be shall provide, or cause to be provided, a box for receiving the bal-procured, lots, and a book for the purpose of entering the voters names, the expenses whereof shall be paid by a tax to be levied on the assessable property of the inhabitants of the town of Havre-de-Grace.

4. AND BE IT ENACTED, That the election shall commence at Election to comthree o'clock in the afternoon, and continue without adjournment, mence at 3 o'clock and be closed at six o'clock in the evening, and the five persons hav-six. ing the greatest number of votes shall be by the judges declared to be the commissioners of the town of Havre-de-Grace for the ensuing year, and the same shall be recorded in the books of the commissioners.
