ment of the youth, and other suitable exercises; and the remainder of the grounds CHAP. belonging to the faid Kent county school may and shall be leased out by the visitors of the faid school for the time being, and by the visitors and governors of the faid college, after the same shall be established, in leases for lives or ninety-nine years, or on any other leases that may be judged most beneficial for advancing the cause of learning, and promoting the said college, agreeable to the original design for which the said Kent county school was founded, and for which the said school lands were purchased.

VIII.

XIV. And he it enacted, That the ordinances which shall be from time to time Ordinances. made by the visitors and governors of the said college, and their successors, with before the gean account of their other proceedings, and of the management of the estate and neral affentmonies committed to their trust, shall, when required, be laid before the general bly, &c affembly of Maryland, for their inspection and examination; but in case at any time hereafter, through overfight, or otherwise through misapprehensions and mistakes, constructions of the powers, liberties and franchises, in this charter or act of incorporation granted or intended to be granted, any ordinances should be made by the faid corporation of vifitors and governors, or any matters done and transacted by the corporation, contrary to the tenor hereof, it is enacted, that although all such ordinances, acts and doings, shall in themselves be null and void, yet they shall not, however, in any courts of law, or by the general affembly, be deemed, taken, interpreted or adjudged, into an avoidance or forfeiture of this charter and act of incorporation, but the same shall be and remain unhurt, inviolate and entire, unto the faid corporation of vifitors and governors, in perpetual succession; and all their acts conformable to the powers, true intent and meaning hereof, shall be and remain in full force and validity, the nullity and avoidance of fuch illegal acts to the contrary in anywife notwithstanding.

XV. And be it enacted and declared, That this charter and act of incorpora- Charter good tion, and every part thereof, shall be good and available in all things in the law, in law, &c. according to the true intent and meaning thereof, and shall be construed, reputed and adjudged, in all cases, most favourably on the behalf and for the best benefit and behoof of the faid visitors and governors, and their successors, so as most effectually to answer the valuable ends of this act of incorporation, towards the general advancement and promotion of useful knowledge, science and virtue.

XVI. And be it enaced, That no person shall act as visitor and governor, or Visitors, &c. as principal or vice-principal, or as professor, in the said college, before he shall oath of sidely take the oath of fidelity and support to this state required by the constitution or ty. by the laws of this state.

C H A P.

An ACT for building a prison in Somerset county, and for other purposes.

The justices are commanded to sell their old prison, at public vendue, and to assess, with their next levy, a sum of money, not exceeding f. 400, wherewithal to purchase, near the old prison, a quantity of ground, not more than one acre, to be laid off with boundaries, by the surveyor, who is to deliver the county clerk a certificate thereof, to be recorded. And on this land the justices shall build a new gaol.

A Supplement to an act, entitled, An act to enable naval officers to grant registers for vessels.

E it enacted, by the general assembly of Maryland, That all ships or ves-Ships may be sels, built by any inhabitant of this state for any citizens of the United registered, &c. States, or any vessel the property of, or built for, a subject of any power or state not at enmity or war with this state, may be registered in the manner directed by this act.
