part of a tract of land called the Resurvey on Salop, the property of the afore- C H A P faid John Threlkeld, into fixty-five lots, and a fufficient number of streets, as appears by the plot of the actual survey thereof made by the said Francis Deakins on the first day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty-four; and the faid Robert Peters, John Threlkeld, William Deakins, junior, and Charles Beatty, have prayed that an act may pass confirming the same as an addition to George-town, and establishing the boundaries thereof as now laid down by the furvey and plot aforesaid, and granting to those who shall be proprietors of the lots fronting on the north side of Water-street, the exclusive right to the ground and water on the fouth side thereof, for the sole purpose of making wharfs, without being allowed to erect any buildings thereon, and vesting a power in the commissioners of George-town to improve, by wharfs for the public good, the land and water fronting Frederick, Fayette, and Gaystreets; and it appearing to this general assembly, that extending the limits of the said town will greatly contribute to the promotion of the trade and commerce thereof, and be of general utility: Therefore,

- II. Be it enafted, by the general affembly of Maryland, That the said parts Land laid our of the tracts of land herein before mentioned and described, and laid out into to be part of Georgefixty-five lots and a fufficient number of streets, as delineated on the plot of the town, ac furvey thereof, made by Francis Deakins on the first day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty-four, be, and they are hereby declared to be, part of George-town aforefaid, and shall have, possess. be entitled to, and enjoy, to all and every intent and purpose, all the immunities, privileges and advantages, which do or shall appertain to the said town, as fully and amply, in every respect, as if the same had been originally part thereof and included therein; and the faid lots and streets, surveyed and laid out in manner herein before fet forth, shall be and they are hereby established and confirmed, according to the delineation and description of the same on the plot of the survey thereof by Francis Deakins, herein before referred to, and in all disputes and controversies which may or shall hereafter happen or arise respecting the location of the faid lots and freets, the faid plot, the bounds and lines therein referred to being proved, shall be conclusive evidence between the parties at whose instance this act is paffed, and all claiming under them.
- III. And he it surfher enasted, That the proprietors of the lots fronting on Proprietors to the north side of Water-street, shall have and enjoy the exclusive right to the have exclusive ground and water on the south side of their respective lots, for the sole purpose of making wharfs, but they shall not be allowed to erect any buildings on the wharfs so to be made by them.

IV The He hat ther enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the com- Committonmissioners of George-town, or the major part of them, and they are hereby em- crs to make wharfs, &c. powered, to make and erect wherfs on the ground and water fronting on Frederick, Fayette and Gay-streets, for the public good, which said wharfs shall be for the use and convenience of all vessels trading to the said town, without paying wharfage or any duty or imposition whatever, for using the same.

Voland be it curther enaited, That for the fafe keeping and preservation of Plot to be the faid plot of the faid addition to George-town, the same shall be deposited taken care of with the commissioners of the said town, who are hereby directed to receive the faid plot, and take care thereof.
