tained between the twenty-second day of March and the fixth day of October, CHAP. in the year feventeen hundred and feventy-four, and for which the common confideration of one shilling sterling per acre was paid, and which certificates were, at the time of passing the said recited act, bond fide the property of any citizen of this or any of the United States.

LXXV.

HI. and be it enaited. That any grant issued or to be issued for any land ly- Grant issued ing within any manor to the westward of Fort Cumberland, shall be void, and for land on manore woir so shall be held and adjudged in any court of law or equity within this state.

IV. And be it enacted, That if any grant hath been obtained, or shall here-Certaingmants. after be obtained, on any certificate returned in virtue of any warrant granted void, &c. between the twenty-second day of March and the fixth day of October, in the year seventeen hundred and seventy-four, which certificate, at the time of passing the said recited act, was not bond side the property of some citizen of this or some one of the United States, or for which the confideration aforesaid was not paid, fuch grant shall be void, and so shall be held and adjudged in any court of law or equity within this state; and the chancellor may offer to the person applying for a grant to be examined upon oath or interrogatories touching the matters aforesaid, and to examine witnesses respecting the same, in order that it may be discovered, in a summary manner, whether the certificate was, at the time of passing the above recited act, bond side the property of some citizen of this or some one of the United States, and the consideration was paid as aforesaid; and if the party shall refuse to be examined upon oath or interrogatories, and to have the matter inquired into in a summary manner, then the chancellor may note the fame, and give information thereof to the attorney-general, who shall file a bill in chancery against such person for the discovery of the truth of the facts by the regular course of the proceeding in the chancery court; and if it shall appear to the chanceller, either upon examination in a summary way aforesaid, or upon a bill being filed as aforesaid, that the certificate upon which patent shall be applied for was not bona fide the property of some citizen of this or some of the United States at the time of passing the above recited act, or that the consideration was not paid as aforefaid, in every fuch case the chancellor shall not order grant to be iffued on fuch certificates, but shall declare the same void and of none effect; and the register of the land-office shall endorse the chancellor's determination on the certificate, and shall make a note thereof in the margin of the record wherein the warrant upon which such certificate was made hath been recorded.

V. and, whereas it is represented to this general assembly, that on fale of latids by the commissioners of the late proprietary to citizens of this state, from the year seventeen handred and fixty-seven to the year seventeen hundred and seventy-one, grants have not issued in some cases where the whole consideration was fatisfied, and in other cases where part of the purchase money remained unpaid, Be it enaited, That where all the purchase money for the sales as afore-Balance to Be faid has been paid, and in case where part only of the purchase money hath been surer, &c. pard, and any purchaser shall pay the balance due to the treasurer of the western fliore, that in either case grant shall issue in the usual form to the purchaser and his heirs; and any money which shall by such purchasers be paid to the said treasurer as aforesaid, shall be by him paid to the legal representative of the late proprietary.

VI. and be it enafted, That if any grant has or shall hereafter issue for any Grants inlands to the westward of Fort Cumberland, on surveys or resurveys, in which cluding vi vacancy is included, made in virtue of warrants granted on or after the fixth day &c. of October, seventeen hundred and seventy-four, such grants shall be void, and so held and adjudged in all courts of law and equity.

VII. and, whereas there may have been surveys to the westward of Fort Cumberland made under warrants granted between the twenty-second day of March and fixth day of October, seventeen hundred and seventy-four, where the quantity Ppppp
