immunities, as by law are incident and necessary to corporations of this kind, CHAP. and which may be necessary to the corporation herein and hereby constituted and LXXVIII. erected, to enable them duly and fully, in the law, to execute all things touching and concerning the defign and intent of their faid incorporation, for the benefit, fuccour and relief, of the widows of fuch clergymen in the orders and communion of the protestant episcopal church aforesaid, as may or shall become contributors to the funds of the faid corporation, agreeable to fuch rules and bye-laws as may be established for the management and payment of annuities to the faid widows, and for the education of their children, and fettling them in some useful business or profession.

C H A P. LXXIX.

An ACT respecting the commerce of this state, to prevent frauds in the customs, and to direct the duty of naval officers, and to regulate the conduct of masters and mariners of merchant

HEREAS the laws respecting commerce, the duty of naval officers, Preamble. the registering of ships and other vessels, and the exportation and importation of goods, wares and merchandise, into this state, do not in many instances apply to the circumstances thereof, fince the establishment of its independence, and different and fuitable provisions and regulations are requisite,

II. Be it enauted, by the general assembly of Maryland, That no ship or What vessels other vessel shall be deemed belonging to this state, and entitled to any privileges are deemed to as such, unless one half thereof, at least, is actually and bona side the property of state, &c. one or more citizen or citizens of this state, and registered agreeably to this act. fuch property to be proved by oath or affirmation of one or more credible witness or witnesses before a naval officer of this state, and a certificate thereof granted by fuch naval officer on the back of the register.

- III. And he it enamed, That every ship or vessel above forty feet keel, one Vessels above fixth part whereof belongs to any citizen of this state, shall be registered in 40 feet keel to be registered. manner and form herein after directed.
- IV. And he it enacted, That if any owner of any vessel of or under forty Registers may feet keel shall defire to have a register for such vessel, the same may be granted smaller vessels. in like manner and form.

V. And he it enacted, That any naval officer of this state may and shall, Form of a reupon application of any owner of any ship or vessel, one sixth part whereof is gister, &c. " officer of the —— district, hereby certify all whom it may concern, that in " pursuance of an act of the general affembly of this state, A. Which faid register shall be signed and sealed by the governor of this state, and counterfigned by the clerk of the council for the time being.

VI. And be it enacted, That the several naval officers shall make due entries Naval officers of every register granted by them, and transmit true lists thereof to the governor to make entries, &c. and council for the time being, in the months of June and December annually.
