fustires to levy money, &c.

III. And be it enacted. That the justices of Anne-Arundel county for the time being, be and they hereby authorised and directed, at their August courts in the years seventeen hundred and eighty-fix, seventeen hundred and eighty-seven, and seventeen hundred and eighty-eight, to impose on the affessable property of the said county, the sum of fitteen hundred pounds current money, to be affessed in three equal portions, together with an allowance to the collector of four per cent. for collection, which fum so affessed shall be collected by the collector of Anne-Arundel county aforesaid as other county taxes are collected, and when so collected shall, by the said sheriff be paid to the commissioners aforesaid, or the major part of them, to be by them applied in purchasing the ground and erecting the said prison.

And pay a ertificate obtained, &c.

IV. And be it enacted, That the justices of Anne-Arundel county shall pay unto the commissioners aforesaid, or the major part of them, a certificate by them obtained for the damage done the old prison by the continental foldiers, amounting to the fum of eleven hundred and fifty-three pounds fixteen shillings and five-pence current money, to be by the said commissioners applied in erecting the said prison.

V. and be it enafted, That the judges of the general court and the to prison, &c. chancellor, shall have a right to commit to the said prison, and any perfon by them committed shall be received into the said prison under the care of such officer as shall be by them respectively appointed.

VI. And be it enacted. That in case any of the said commissioners shall die, remove, or be incapable to act, the residue, or the major part of them, shall fill up the vacancy.

Passed March An ACT to settle and pay the civil list, and other expences of civil government.

Preamble.

HEREAS those who dedicate their time, abilities and labour, to the public, ought to receive a reasonable and adequate compensation for their services,

Officers falaries, &c.

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the several officers of civil government for the time being, shall be entitled to receive at the rate of the following salaries in current money for the ensuing year, to wit: Each member of the council two hundred pounds, the chancellor. as judge of the land-office, two hundred pounds current money, the treasurer of the western shore sive hundred pounds current money, the treasurer of the eastern shore two hundred and fifty pounds, the clerk of the council two hundred and fifty pounds, the messenger to the council feventy-five pounds, the clerk of the senate seventy-five pounds, the clerk of the house of delegates one hundred pounds, the clerk of the court of appeals thirty pounds, the printer to the state five hundred pounds, the deputy to the treasurer of the western shore two hundred and fifty pounds, the auditor-general four hundred and fifty pounds, the deputy auditor one hundred and seventy-five pounds.

To be paid III. And he it enacted, That the said salaries shall be paid quarterly quarterly, &c. out of the arrearages of the taxes due for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-
