A Supplement to an act, entitled, An act to open and establish a Passed May public road in Dorchester county.

HEREAS an act of affembly passed at November session, seventeen Preamble. hundred and eighty-three, empowering Michael Hall Bonwill, of Dorchester county, to open a road from the main road that leads from New-Market to the town of Vienna to his mill, and from his mill to the main road that leads from Cambridge to the town of Vienna: And whereas Joseph Richardson, Willis Newton and James Steele, were appointed commissioners for the purpose of laying out said road, and to ascertain the damages done any person or persons by the said road passing through their lands, and the aforefaid Joseph Richardson and Willis Newton died before the road aforesaid was laid

II. We it enasted, by the general affembly of Maryland, That John Gos-Commission, len and Edward Thompson are hereby appointed commissioners in the place of ers appointed, &c. Joseph Richardson and Willis Newton, and shall have the same powers to act in the business aforesaid as the aforesaid Joseph Richardson and Willis Newton were vested with under the original act.

An ACT to empower William Berry Warman, a minor, admini- Paffed May strator with the will annexed, and refiduary legatee, of Wil-15. liam Berry, deceased, to sell the lands therein mentioned, and to apply the money arifing therefrom.

HEREAS William Berry Warman, a minor, administrator with the Preamble will annexed, and refiduary legatee, of William Berry, late of Prince-George's county, deceased, by his petition to this general assembly, hath set forth, that he is seized of three tracts or parcels of land, lying in Prince-George's county aforesaid, to wit, Berry's Enclosure, containing three hundred and forty-seven acres, Oxen Hill, containing seventy acres, and Holly Spring, containing fifty acres, devised to him by the faid William Berry, which lands, not being settled, are rather a burthen to him; that the estate of the said William Berry is much involved by reason of debts and legacies, which the personal estate is scarcely sufficient to discharge, and prayed that an act may pass to enable him to sell and convey the aforesaid lands, and the money arising therefrom to apply towards the payment of the debts and legacies aforefaid, so that he may be able to fave some part of the personal estate for his own use; which being thought reasonable,

II. Be it enacted, by the general affembly of Maryland, That the said Wil- W. B. Warliam Berry Warman be, and he is hereby empowered and enabled, to fell and dif-man empowered and enabled. pose of the aforesaid lands, lying in Prince-George's county aforesaid, to wit, lands, &c. Berry's Enclosure, Oxen Hill and Holly Spring, which were devised to him by the faid William Berry, and the same, when fold, to make over and convey to the purchaser or purchasers in see-simple, by good and sufficient deed or deeds in law; and the money arising from such sale to apply and appropriate to the payment and discharge of the just debts due from the estate of the said William Berry, and the pecuniary legacies by his last will and testament bequeathed; provided nevertheless, that the said William Berry Warman, before such sale as aforesaid, enter into bond with such security as shall be approved by the orphans court of Prince-George's county, with a condition to apply and appropriate fo much of the money arising from such sale as may be necessary to pay and discharge the just debts due from the estate of the said William Berry, and the pecuniary legacies by his last will and testament bequeathed.
