C H A P. and council were authorised and requested to establish a public arsenal at Frederick-town, in Frederick county, for the reception of public arms and accountements, and were authorised and requested to appoint an armourer at the same place, and also an armourer at Talbot-town, on the eastern shore, and to allow them falaries: And whereas the governor and council, in virtue of the faid powers, did appoint a certain Peter Eugles armourer at Frederick-town, and Jeremiah Banning armourer at Talbot-town: And whereas no provision was made by the faid act for the payment of the falary of the faid armourers, or any other debts to be incurred by the public under the powers therein given to the governor

Governor and council to draw on the

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the governor and council be authorised and empowered to draw on the treasurer of the western treasurer, &c. or eastern shore in favour of the several persons who may have claims against the public for fervices performed under the faid recited act, or may be performed under contracts with the governor and council in execution of the faid act, provided the faid claims be ascertained by proper vouchers, and the sum allowed proportioned to the services performed.

Who shall pay faid orders,

III. And he it enaded, That the treasurer of the western or eastern shore shall be and are hereby authorised and required, to pay the said orders out of any money not otherwise particularly appropriated, or to iffue his certificates for the amount of the said orders, which shall be receivable by the treasurers of either shore in the same manner as certificates are received from persons having claims on the journal of accounts.

An ACT to provide for the collection of taxes due in Anne-Arundel county, and for other purposes.

W. Campbell auth rifed to collect, &c.

E it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That William Campbell be authorifed and empowered to collect all the state taxes due in such I of the districts of Anne-Arundel county, for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-fix, as have had no collector appointed and qualified as the law directs; he shall also have authority to collect, in all the districts of the said county, the fund tax for the years seventeen hundred and eighty-seven, eightyeight and eighty-nine; but before the said William Campbell shall exercise any authority hereby given, he shall enter into bond, with such security as the governor and the council shall approve, for the faithful performance of the duties enjoined by this act.

By distress and Yale, &c.

II. And he it enasted, That the said William Campbell shall have power to collect the faid taxes by diffress and fale, in the same manner as other collectors are empowered to collect by the act for raising supplies for the year seventeen hundred and eighty-fix; and that the faid William Campbell, or other person or persons to be appointed under this act, shall be allowed the same commission for collecting the faid taxes that is allowed to other collectors.

To settle with

III. And be it enacted, That if the said William Campbell, or the person or the treaturer, persons to be appointed in case of his refusal or neglect to act, shall, on or before the first day of July next, settle with the treasurer of the western shore, and pay the whole of that part which is called the ten shilling tax, heretofore appropriated to congress, in specie, he or they shall, in such case, have a right and privilege of paying the residue of the taxes in the same manner as by the said supply bill the people are authorised to pay the collectors; but if he or they shall not pay the faid ten shilling tax in specie by the first day of July next, he and they shall, in that case, have no other right or privilege, with respect to the mode of payment, than other collectors.

IV. And be it enacted, That the fund tax shall be collected from the people And collect the rand tax, by him, or the person or persons to be appointed, in the same manner as by other collectors.
