the purpose of receiving a statement in writing of all the debts, claims and de- CHAP. mands, of creditors, against the estate of the said John Mitchell, and of the amount, nature, and quality thereof; and having so fixed upon such day, the said trustees shall immediately cause public notice to be given of their intentions to meet at fuch time and place for the purposes aforesaid, and shall cause advertisements thereof to be fet up at the most public places in their and the adjoining counties, and to be printed in the Maryland and Delaware Gazettes, at least for the space of thirty days before such intended meeting; and the said trustees, or a major part of them, shall accordingly attend at such time and place, and then and there receive from the creditors of the faid John Mitchell respectively, a statement of their debts and claims, and of the amount, nature, and quality thereof, on the oath or affirmation of the parties; and the faid trustees, or a major part of them, shall diligently inquire after the whole real estate of the said John Mitchell, lying and being in the counties of Somerset and Worcester aforesaid, or elsewhere in this state, and shall take the possession, charge, and management thereof, and within the space of fix weeks after the time herein before intended for the meeting of the faid trustees, they shall certify to the chancellor a regular statement, subscribed by them, of the real property aforesaid of the said John Mitchell, and of the particulars thereof as to buildings and improvements, and the quantity, quality and fituation, of the lands, and also of the names, debts, claims and demands, of the respective creditors, according to the document thereof furnished by each; and such statement shall be filed with the register of the court of chancery, and fafely kept for the inspection and examination of the parties con-

IV. And he it enaced, That the chancellor shall thereupon direct a public Chancellor to fale of the faid real property to be made by the faid trustees, in such lots, parcels direct a public fale, &c. or proportions, and at such respective times and places, and upon such public notice, terms and credit, and in other respects in such manner as he shall think most advantageous for the interest of the creditors and this state, and most proper for securing a punctual payment of the purchase money, and shall certify fuch directions to the faid trustees, who shall and they are hereby required to govern themselves according to the tenor thereof; and the said trustees shall return a particular account of their proceedings at fuch fales to the faid chancellor, as foon thereafter as conveniently may be, stating the several lots or parcels of land fold, and to whom, the amount of each, the time of payment, and the fecurity given, and shall subscribe the same; and any deed or deeds given by the faid trustees, or a major part of them, as such, to any purchaser or purchasers of the faid property, or any part thereof, upon a fair fale made pursuant to this act, after acknowledgment and enrolment thereof according to law, shall be valid and available to transfer and confirm such property to the said purchaser or purchasers in fee-simple, in like manner as if the same had been sold and conveyed by the said John Mitchell in his life-time, or secured by the state in virtue of a patent grounded on the escheat.

V. And he it further enasted, That the said chancellor, upon examination To direct the of the faid statement and account, shall direct the proportion and order of pay-proportion, ment according to the claims of the respective creditors, and a course of distribution, having also a just regard to debts or judgments, by which such property may be bound, and to their nature and value; and if any creditors shall elect to take the bonds of the purchasers to the amount of their respective claims in discharge thereof, (if the fale of the faid property shall be on credit,) it shall be lawful for the faid trustees, or a major part of them, to assign so much thereof as shall be sufficient, or otherwise the claims of such creditors shall remain postponed until the payment of the money by the respective purchasers of the said property.
