XXXVI. And he it enacted, That the power and jurisdiction of the justices Jurisdiction appointed, commissioned and qualified, under the present act for the more effectual to continue, punishment of criminals, shall continue until the second Tuesday in January next.

C H A P. XLV.

An ACT to amend and alter fundry parts of an act of affembly Paffed Depassed at November session, seventeen hundred and eighty-two, cember 25. entitled, An act for the more effectual paving the streets of Baltimore-town, in Baltimore county, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

THEREAS by an act of assembly passed at November session, seventeen Preamble. hundred and eighty-two, for the more effectual paving the streets of Baltimore-town, in Baltimore county, and for other purposes therein mentioned, it was enacted, that a tax of twelve shillings and fixpence should be levied on every foot of improved or unimproved lots in those parts of the streets fixed on to be paved, or that might have been then paved under a former law, and also a tax of fix shillings and three-pence on every foot front of improved and unimproved lots in those parts of the lanes and alleys fixed on to be paved, or that might have been then paved under a former act: And whereas the price of materials and labour hath fallen very confiderably fince the passage of the said act,

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the sum of Six shillings fix shillings and three-pence current money only be hereafter levied on every foot and threefront of improved or unimproved lots in those parts of the streets which shall be be levied, &c. hereafter paved, and the fum of three shillings and two-pence current money only on every foot front of improved or unimproved lots in those parts of the lanes and alleys which shall be hereafter paved by the said special commissioners appointed by virtue of the faid act of November session, seventeen hundred and eighty-two, for the more effectual paving the streets of Baltimore-town, in Baltimore county, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

III. And he it enacted. That no street, lane or alley whatever, within the No street, limits of Baltimore-town, shall be hereafter paved by virtue of the said act of &c. to be November session, seventeen hundred and eighty-two, unless the same be done consent, &c.

IV. And he it enamed, That in every case where the special commissioners Commissionshall be of opinion that any particular street, lane or alley, ought to be paved by ers, when a street is to be virtue of the act aforesaid, notice thereof shall be given to the clerk of the town paved, to call commissioners, who shall immediately thereupon call a meeting of the said town a meeting, for the purpose of fixing a day when the said town commissioners. commissioners, for the purpose of fixing a day when the said town commissioners shall meet again, to determine on the propriety of paving the said street, lane or alley.
