fixty-eight, purchased from Josias Slade sour acres of land for the use of the church of the said parish of Saint-John's, for the sum of thirty pounds current money, and the faid Slade contracted to convey the fame to the faid rector and vestry; that since a church was erected on the said four acres of ground, and that fince that time the parish of Saint-John's has been divided, and a part of the faid parish called the Parish of Saint-James; that the four acres of ground aforesaid are, in consequence of the said division, in Saint-James's parish; and that the title to the faid four acres never was in the faid Slade, but was vested by the law of confiscation, and now is, in the state of Maryland; and prayed that an act may pass relinquishing the right of the state in the said four acres, and vesting the same in the said vestry of Saint-James's parish;

CHAP

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all the right, Right retitle and interest, of the state of Maryland, in and to the aforesaid four acres of land, be and it is hereby released and relinquished, and the same fully and completely vested in the vestry of Saint-James's parish aforesaid, and their successors, for ever, as their estate and inheritance for the use of the church of the said parish.

H A P.

An ACT to appoint commissioners to sell and dispose of certain Passed December 27 lands belonging to Stepney parish, in Somerset county, and to apply the money arifing from the fales thereof.

THEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, by the petition of Presmble the inhabitants of Stepney parish, in Somerset county, that in the purchase of land for creeting and building a chapel on in the town of Salisbury, in said parish, more was bought than was necessary for that purpose, and that the faid parish is in considerable arrears, for the payment of which there is no fund: And whereas it is further represented, that the furplus land may be laid off in lots, and fold to great advantage, and enable the faid parish to discharge the debts against it, and provide a fund for the keeping the church and chapels of faid parish in repair;

II. Be it enssted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That William Stone, Commission-ers appointed. Francis Hutchins Waters, William Done, George Day Scott, George Robertson, &c. Esquire, Charles Dashiell, senior, and Tubman Lowes, be and they are hereby appointed committioners for the purpose of carrying this act into execution; and the faid commissioners, or any five of them, are hereby authorised and empowered to lay off all the ground belonging to the parish of Stepney, in the town of Salisbury, except the ground whereon the chapel stands, with one acre adjoining the same, in lots, as they may think most convenient, and sell, and convey in seefimple, any and all of the faid lots, either at public or private fale, to any person or persons, as they may find most advantageous, and pay the money arising from the fale thereof to the felect veftry of faid parish for the time being, who are hereby authorised and empowered, upon receipt of the said money from said commissioners, to discharge the debts now existing against said parish, and place the balance that may remain in their hands out to interest, upon bond with good and fufficient fecurity, taken in the name of the said select vestry, in trust for the use and benefit of the faid parish, the interest whereof shall be paid annually, and applied by faid select vestry to the purpose of keeping the church and chapels of faid parish of Stepney in repair.

VII. H A P.

An ACT to enable the justices of Saint-Mary's county to affes Paffed December 27 a fum of money on the faid county for the support of James Mills, fon of John, of the faid county.

THEREAS it is represented to this general affembly, by the petition of Preamble. James Mills, son of John, that from a variety of circumstances he is reduced to poverty, and being much afflicted with the gout, and
