Justices to levy money,

II. Be it therefore enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the justices of Prince-George's county court shall have full power and authority, at their enfuing meeting, and annually hereafter, to affess and levy on the affessable property in their said county, a sum of money sufficient for the support, maintenance and safe custody, of the said James Ranter; and that the faid justices are hereby authorised and empowered to fafely keep the faid James Ranter, either in the county of Prince-George's, or to fend him for fafe custody to any part of this state, or the United States, and that the expences which have arisen in confining the faid James Ranter, and the expences which shall hereafter arise, shall be defrayed by the county of Prince-George's, in such manner as the county charge of faid county is defrayed annually,

C H A P. LX.

Passed Mar. 2. An A.C.T to vest in James Chappalear and Thomas Lock, of Saint Mazo ry's county, the title to a tract or parcel of land purchased by Joseph Burroughs, lying and being in Calverton manor, in Charles county.

CONTRACTOR LXI.

Passed Mar. 9. An A.C.T to prevent the exportation of unmerchantable to-bacco.

Preamble.

THEREAS it is effentially necessary to the commerce of this state to prevent the exportation of unmerchantable tobacco,

No tobacco to ed, &c.

II. Be it enasted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That after the unless inspect. first day of April next, it shall not be lawful to export or carry out of this state, by water or land, any tobacco, unless in hogsheads, which shall be inspected, passed, marked, stamped and branded, at some public warehouse, agreeably to the directions of this act, or of the act, entitled, An act for the regulation of the staple of tobacco, passed June session seventeen hundred and eighty; and if any person shall export by water out of this state, any tobacco, contrary to this act, or shall lade any tobacco on board any vessel for exportation out of this state, contrary to this act, such person shall forfeit and pay one shilling current money for every pound of tobacco for exported, or shipped for exportation, and the said tobacco, fo laden on board any vessel for exportation, contrary to this act, together with such vessel, and her tackle, apparel and furniture, shall be forfeited, and may be leized by any person, and shall be condemned in the court of admiralty, one half to the use of the person making the seizure, and the other half to the use of the state; and if any master or commander of any vessel small receive any tobacco on board any vessel by him commanded, for exportation, contrary to this act, or shall have knowledge that any such tobacco is on board, and shall not make the same known to the naval officer, before or at the time of clearing out his veffel, he shall, on conviction thereof in the general court, or any county court, be fined not exceeding one thoufand pounds current money, and imprisoned without bail not exceeding one year, or both, in the discretion of the court; and if any person shall carry any tobasso by land out of this state, contrary to this act, or shall lade or put in any waggon, cart, or other carriage, any tobacco, with intent to carry the same out of this state contrary to this act, such person high forfeit five pounds current money for every hogshead of tobacco, (if 4 14.41
