<sup>1</sup>Maryland was entitled to 10 electoral votes but two electors from the First District (Causin and Kent) did not attend and vote at the Annapolis meeting on December 5, 1832.

<sup>2</sup>Because of the radical (and believed unfair) redistricting by the National-Republican dominated state legislature, the Democratic electors in Frederick County withdrew for the presidential contest. This led to some scattered votes for other individuals: P. Owings, J. Shriver, A. Kirshaw and J. Baumgardner each received 13 votes; P. Burkhard received 3; G. Grover, J. Barry and C. Gilden received 2 votes each; and W. Gamble and G. Harris received 1 vote each.

<sup>3</sup>Elias Brown had been a Jackson elector in 1824 and 1828. He ran again but evidently without the full backing of the party. References under Cornelius Howard do not indicate that he ran with any party affiliation. In computing a popular vote total in the state for Jackson, the combined votes of Brown and Smith are generally utilized. However, Brown was selected as a Whig elector in 1836.
