¹Most election reports and tables do not credit Maryland with any third party votes in 1876. However, manuscript returns filed with the Maryland Secretary of State reveal 9 votes cast for a set of electors in Montgomery County and one set of votes in Worcester County. The Greenback party is credited with 51 votes in various newspapers for the following counties: Howard (2), Washington (9), and Baltimore City (40). However, the official manuscript returns do not indicate any third party votes in these subdivisions.
