¹The States' Rights candidates for president, Strom Thurmond, and vice president, Fielding J. Wright conducted a write-in campaign and had their votes separately reported. The county summary sheet on file with the State Administrative Board of Elections, reflects 2,474 votes for Thurmond (2 fewer than officially reported). Even this number is suspect as county reports do not contian wirte-in votes. The Democratic Advocate, November 12, 1948, p.1, and Frederick News, November 4, 1948, p.2. In addition the Baltimore Sun on November 3, 1948 reported votes for Thurmond in Howard (19) and Montgomery (161) and higher totals in Calvert (61), Somerset (22) and Talbot (27) Counties. This discrepancy is likely caused by the provision that local Boards of Elections did not have to transmit records of write-in votes unless the candidate received more tha 1 percent of the total vote.
