<sup>1</sup>The "deciding ballot" vote represents the preferences of the Maryland delegates on the roll call in which the party's nominee was chosen, before the shifting of any votes pursuant to calls for a unanimous selection or a bandwagon movement.

<sup>2</sup>The Democratic party split at their Baltimore convention with a portion of the Maryland delegation leaving the floor along with most of the southern delegates. At a splinter convention, the bolting Marylanders supported John C. Breckinridge for President under the Southern Democrat label.

<sup>3</sup>Under state law applicable in 1972, some Maryland delegates elected directly on the primary ballot as pledged to other candidates were bound to vote for George Wallace as he won the Maryland primary on May 16, 1972.
