The Electors proceeded to ballot for President of the United States for the term beginning from and after the third day of March 1901, in conformity with the requirements of the Constitution and Law.

Mr J. Frank Parris nominated William McKinley of the state of Ohio, for President of the United States for the said term. Mr Albin G. Thomas seconded the nomination. The President appointed as tellers Messrs.

The ballots of the Electors were deposited in a ballot box which had been delivered to the tellers Messrs Orr & McCallough who on counting the ballots, reported that eight votes had been cast and that all of them were for William McKinley of the state of Ohio for President of the United States, and that no other person had been voted for.

Whereupon, it was decreed by the Chair that William McKinley of the state of Ohio, had received eight (8) votes for President of the United States, from and after the third day of March next ensuing, being the whole number of votes to which the State of Maryland is entitled.

On motion of Mr Henry Parris the Electors proceeded to ballot for Vice-President of the United States for the ensuing term. Mr Henry Parris nominated Theodore Roosevelt of the State of New York, for said term.

The President appointed as tellers Messrs. <sup>Hopper</sup> ~~Orr~~ and ~~McCallough~~ Merdick

The ballots of the were deposited in a ballot box which had been delivered to Messrs <sup>Hopper</sup> ~~Orr~~ and <sup>Meredick</sup> ~~McCallough~~ who on counting the ballots, reported that eight (8) votes had been cast, and that all of them were for Theodore Roosevelt of the State of New York, for Vice-President of the United States, and that no other ~~person~~ had been voted for.
