

We further certify that Thomas R. Marshall of the State of Indiana was then and there put in nomination for Vice President of the United States for four years from and after the third day of March next ensuing.

That we then and there proceeded to vote by ballot in pursuance of the Constitution and Laws of the United States for Vice President of the United States, and that on account of the ballots it was ascertained that Thomas R. Marshall of the State of Indiana had received eight votes, and that no other person was voted for.

We further certify that there were distinct ballots for President and Vice-President.

The annexed distinct lists of the said persons with the votes given to the same are hereby returned by us, the Electors of President and Vice-President of the United States in and for the State of Maryland in pursuance of the Constitution and Laws of the United States as having the aforesaid number of votes.

Done at the City of Annapolis, Maryland, on the second Monday of January, being the thirteenth day of said month, in the year nineteen hundred and thirteen.
