

# Governor's Proclamation Declaring the Election of Electors of President and Vice President.

1924

I, Albert C. Ritchie, Governor of the State of Maryland, in pursuance of Section 3 of the Act of Congress approved February 3rd, 1887, do hereby certify that from a certified copy of the Declaration of the Result of a Election held in the State of Maryland on Tuesday, November 4th, 1924, for eight Electors of President and Vice President of the United States, made and transmitted to me by the Board of State Commissioners in accordance with law and filed in my office, it appears that:-
