Proceedings of Electors of President and Vice President of the United States of America, in and for the State of Maryland.

At 11 A.M., on Monday, December 18, 1972, the Electors of President and Vice President of the United States of America, in and for the State of Maryland, assembled in the State House in Annapolis.

There were present W. Blau Harcum, James P. S. Nevereux, A. Wade Kach, John A. Cade, Robert Beall, James C. Baumgardner, Samuel Barber, Jane B. Lockwood, William W. Gullett and Carole Plante. William W. Gullett was elected President and Jane B. Lockwood, Secretary.

The following Proclamation, in sextuplicate, was received from Governor Marvin Mandel of Maryland.
