On the First Wednesday, in December, the Fifth day of the said Month, in the year one Thousand eight Hundred and Thirty two, being the day appointed by the Constitution and Laws of the United States of America, in which the Electors of President and Vice President of the United States are directed to assemble and perform the trust reposed in them, there appeared, in the Court Chamber, in the City of Annapolis, being the place provided by law for the meeting of the said Electors, the following Gentlemen, who had been proclaimed by the Executive Authority of the State of Maryland, as duly elected Electors of President and Vice President of the United States of America, in and for the said State of Maryland, to wit:

For the First District,

Williams B. Tyler, and
Williams Price Loggins;

For the Second District,

Lupton T. Heath, and
Williams Wick Loggins;

For the Third District,

John Spear Smith Loggins;

For the Fourth District,

John N. Steele Robert H. Goldbroough
Loggins and Albert Constable Loggins.

Joseph Kent and James S. Carson Loggins, who had also been proclaimed by the Executive Authority of the State of Maryland, as duly elected from the First District, Electors of President and Vice President of the United States of America, in and for the said State of Maryland, were prevented from attending by ill health, and did not appear.

On motion of Mr. Heath, the Electors proceeded to organize, & shew,

The Honorable Robert H. Goldbroough was chosen President, and for: H. Nicholas, Secretary.

Mr. Andrews & Sons was appointed Messengers, and Mr. Samuel Peare Door Keeper.

The Electors then proceeded to ballot for President and Vice President of the United States of America, in conformity with the requirements of the Constitution and Laws of the United States of America
