Sec. 7. And be it enacted. That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 589.

AN ACT to authorize and direct the Board of School Commissioners of Montgomery County to erect in the town of Gaithersburg, in said county, a high school building, and to purchase the land for the purpose of building said high school on, and to direct the County Commissioners of said county to pay for the same and to borrow money for that purpose, and to issue bonds of said county for the money so borrowed, not exceeding eight thousand dollars.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Board of School Commissioners of Montgomery County be and they are hereby authorized and required, before Required to September 15, 1904, to erect in the town of Gaithersburg, in erect high Montgomery County, a suitable and commodious building for school building. a high school in said town, and to purchase a suitable site or lot or piece of land on which to erect said high school building.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That the County Commissioners of said county be and they are hereby authorized and directed to pay to the order of the Board of County School Commis-Funds for sioners of said county such sum or sums of money, not exceed- building ing eight thousand dollars, as shall be needed for the purchase of said land, and for the erection and proper equipment of said building.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That for the purpose aforesaid the said County Commissioners of said county are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to borrow such sum of money, not exceeding eight thousand dollars, as shall be needed for such purposes; and to secure said money the said County Commissioners are further authorized and empowered to issue To issue the bonds of said county for such amount, not, however, exceeding the sum of eight thousand dollars, and in such denomination and for such period or periods as said County Commissioners may deem expedient; the said bonds to be issued in series maturing as said County Commissioners shall determine, and bear interest not exceeding four per centum per annum from date; all of which bonds shall be exempt from
