including witnesses, twenty-five cents. But in no case shall any other than one fee be allowed where several warrants are issued growing out of or from one incident or disturbance; the trial shall be so held as to hear all parties concerned, and but one fee of costs be allowed by the County Commissioners. The fees for services of the justices of the peace of the Sixth District, and in Brooklyn, Fifth Election District, shall be the same as herein allowed the justices of the peace of other districts, but shall be taxed, collected and accounted for by them as in preceding sections of this Act.

178D. The constables of Anne Arundel County (except in the Sixth District and for the Eastport precinct of the Second Election District, wherein no constable shall be appointed by the County Commissioners other than the police officer, who shall not receive any pay for doing criminal work other than his monthly salary) shall be entitled to the fees prescribed by the now existing laws for the particular services rendered, except the fee allowed for serving summons for witness and return, and for such services they shall be allowed the sum of twenty-five cents for each of the first three witnesses for the State summoned and returned, and for each additional witness the sum of five cents; and if the defendant shall demand in writing any witnesses to be summoned, then the same fees shall be allowed for the summoning of such witnesses for the defendant. The fees of the constable for the Sixth District shall be allowed and paid the sum of sixty dollars monthly, to be paid by the County Commissioners of the county, and the regular fees now allowed by law shall be collected, paid to and accounted for by the justices of the peace of said district or either of them, and paid over to the County Commissioners, and no warrant shall be issued by the justice of the peace to the constable of said Sixth District on the oath or affirmation of any other constables, and no warrant shall be issued by said justice of the peace to said constables on the oath or affirmation of any police officer of the City of Annapolis; and when any warrant is issued by a justice of the peace on the complaint, oath or affirmation of any constable, sheriff, deputy sheriff or other officer, and such charge shall be dismissed or the defendant acquitted, no fees in such cases shall be allowed by the County Commissioners, or the Mayor, Councilor or Aldermen to any officer serving such warrant or other process. The constable of the Sixth District of said county, for the service of all processes and summonses for witnesses made by him in criminal cases, shall receive from the County Commissioners the sum of fifty dollars per month, payable in cash
