

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Comptroller of the State is hereby directed to issue his warrant upon the Treasury of the State for the sum of three thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary to defray the expense of painting and repairs to the Executive Mansion fence, together with grading and paving with vitrified bricks or other suitable material the paths and driveways of the grounds of the Executive Mansion.

Appropriation for improvement of Executive Mansion grounds.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That said work be done under the personal direction of the Governor.

Governor to supervise work.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 646.

AN ACT to make an appropriation for the Maryland Board of Pharmacy.

WHEREAS, Chapter 179 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at its January Session of 1902, provided that the Governor should appoint five skilled and competent pharmacists to be known as the Maryland Board of Pharmacy, and the members of said Board, in consideration of the duties they were to perform as prescribed by the said law, were to receive a salary of fifty dollars per year and expenses, and the secretary of said Board was to receive a salary of two hundred dollars per year; and

Maryland Board of Pharmacy.

WHEREAS, The members of the said Board have received no salary since May 1, 1903, and have paid their own expenses while performing their duties as members of the Board, for which amounts they have not been reimbursed, and are now entitled to the sum of six hundred dollars for back salaries and expenses; therefore,

Reimbursement for back salaries.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the sum of twenty-four hundred dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated for the salaries and expenses of the members of the said Maryland Board of Pharmacy up to and including the thirtieth day of September, 1905, the said sum of twenty-four hundred dollars to be paid to the Maryland Board of Pharmacy in two equal annual payments.
