

LAWS OF MARYLAND.

CHAPTER 647.

AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money to pay the remaining indebtedness on the Armory of the Fourth Regiment, Maryland National Guard, situated on West Fayette street, near Paca street, in the City of Baltimore.

WHEREAS, The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore City have by an ordinance leased the building and ground formerly known as the Western Female High School, situate on West Fayette street, near Paca street, in the City of Baltimore to the Fourth Regiment, Maryland National Guard, to be used by it for the purpose of an armory; and

Indebtedness.

WHEREAS, In the remodeling of said building into an armory an indebtedness of twenty thousand dollars remains unpaid thereon; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the sum of twenty thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated to pay the indebtedness incurred and remaining unpaid in repairing, remodeling and refitting the building now in the City of Baltimore for the purpose of an armory for the Fourth Regiment, Maryland National Guard.

To be paid out

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the said sum of twenty thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, so appropriated, shall be paid out of any funds in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated in the year 1904, by the Treasurer of the State of Maryland to the Adjutant-General of the State of Maryland, to be used by him in paying debts incurred and now remaining unpaid in making the necessary repairs, alterations and improvements to said building.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
