

51D. Every person who violates any of the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars; provided, that all fines and costs, including the expense of inspection and analysis imposed under this section shall be covered into the State Treasury, and all vinegar sold or offered for sale in violation of the provisions of this Act shall be subject to forfeiture and spoilation.

Fines and costs to cover inspection and analysis.

51E. Magistrates and justices of the peace throughout the State shall have jurisdiction to hear and determine actions arising for violations of the provisions of this Act, and to hold for court or impose the penalties provided therein, subject to appeal, as the law shall direct.

Jurisdiction to hear and determine cases.

51F. The sum of five hundred dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated to carry out the provisions of this Act. The money so appropriated shall be paid by the Treasurer of the State upon the warrant of the Comptroller, to the State Board of Health for the purposes herein contemplated.

Appropriation to carry out provisions of this Act.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from July 1, 1904.

CHAPTER 654.

AN ACT to add additional sections to Article 10 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Dorchester County," sub-title "Fish," to be known as Sections 186A, 186B and 186C; and to add additional sections to Article 21 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Talbot County," sub-title "Fish," to be known as Sections 116A, 116B and 116C; and to add additional sections to Article 6 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Caroline County," sub-title "Fish," to be known as Sections 146A, 146B and 146C.

WHEREAS, It is desirable to secure greater uniformity in the Local Laws of the Counties of Caroline, Talbot and Dorchester, in this State, governing the protection and increase of the food fish in all the waters of the said counties in order to accomplish a more equitable and effectual enforcement thereof.
