

be satisfied that the same is absolutely necessary to secure the ends of justice and the attendance of such witnesses; for each attachment for contempt, twenty-five cents, provided that no justice of the peace appointed to sit at the station-houses at Mt. Winans and St. Denis, respectively, in the 13th Election District, shall be entitled to receive from the County Commissioners more than forty dollars as fees for his services in criminal cases in any one month, and that no justice of the peace, other than a station house justice, shall be entitled to receive from said County Commissioners more than ten dollars as fees for his services in criminal cases in any one month, and that the justice of the peace selected to sit at the station house in Canton, in the 12th Election District, shall receive from the County Commissioners the sum of eighty-three dollars and thirty-three cents per month, or a proportionate part thereof, so long as he shall continue to act at said station house, under the selection of the Governor as hereinbefore set forth, which sum of money shall be paid to him by the Treasurer of Baltimore County on the order of the County Commissioners at the end of each month of his said service, or a proportionable part thereof at the end of any portion of a month at which the service of such justice of the peace at said station house may terminate as hereinbefore provided; and no justice of the peace selected for said station house shall be permitted to charge any fee except for the use of the county as hereinafter provided, or receive any gratuity for granting any release, or for the performance of any duty required by law.

142H. The aforesaid fees of said constables and justices for said county shall be taxed against and paid by the party against whom judgment shall be rendered, unless he or she be discharged therefrom by due course of law; if such party against whom judgment is rendered is unable to pay the same, such fees shall be paid by said County Commissioners, subject to the limitation set forth in Sections 142F and 142G.

142I. Every justice of the peace appointed under this subdivision of this Article shall file with the County Commissioners of Baltimore County on the first Wednesday of each and every month an account verified by his oath or affirmation, of all fines, forfeitures and penalties imposed by him under the laws of this State and received during the preceding month, which said account shall show the names of the respective defendants, the Acts of Assembly, provisions of law, or charges under which said fines, forfeitures and penalties
