sum and shall be disqualified from holding his office, and any justice of the peace making any false return under said section shall be deemed guilty of perjury, and on conviction thereof shall be liable for the penalties prescribed by law for that offence and shall forever thereafter be disqualified from holding office of any kind in the State of Maryland.

142M. If any justice of the peace or constable appointed under the provisions of this sub-division of this Article be misdemeanor in office other in office. convicted in a court of law of any misdemeanor in office other than those herein otherwise provided for, his removal from said office shall be part of the sentence or judgment pronounced upon him by the said court.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That all prior Acts inconsistent with the provisions of this Act be and the same are hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted. That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

## CHAPTER 71.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 13 of Article 26 of the Code of Public General Laws of the State of Maryland, entitled "Courts," sub-title "Inspection of Records," in so far as the same relates to Montgomery County.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 13 of Article 26 of the Code of Public General Laws of the State of Maryland, entitled "Courts." sub-title "Inspection of Records," be and the same is hereby repealed in so far as the same relates to Montgomery County, and re-enacted to apply to Montgomery County so as to read as follows:

13.
