

To meet first Monday in June after election. SEC. 5. *And be it enacted,* That the Commissioners shall meet in some convenient place in said town on or before the first Monday in June following their election and as often thereafter as may be necessary to the discharge of their duties.

Judges of election. SEC. 6. *And be it enacted,* That said Commissioners annually, on or before the first Monday in April in each year, appoint three judges of election, who shall conduct the elections according to the election laws of the State, except that the hours of election shall be from 2 o'clock to 5 o'clock P.M.; except further, that one of said judges may act as clerk of said election; and except further, that the ballots used may be such as were used at elections prior to the adoption of the "Australian System." The said judges of election shall certify to the County Commissioners the result of said election, and the three candidates receiving the greatest number of votes they shall be declared elected, but said judges of election shall receive no compensation for their services. The first election shall be held before H. M. Hilton, J. M. Brown and B. F. Roberson, who are hereby appointed judges for that purpose.

Clerk and Treasurer. SEC. 7. *And be it enacted,* That said Commissioners shall annually appoint a clerk, who may also be treasurer, and who shall keep the minutes of their proceedings in a well-bound book, which shall be open at any time to the inspection of any one interested. If said Commissioners appoint the clerk treasurer, the said clerk shall give a bond in such sum as the Commissioners shall deem proper, and shall pay out the money that shall come into his hands only on the order of the Commissioners, which order shall plainly appear in the minutes.

Bailiff. SEC. 8. *And be it enacted,* That the Commissioners shall annually appoint a bailiff and such under bailiffs as may be necessary.

Compensation. SEC. 9. *And be it enacted,* That the Commissioners shall allow their clerk and bailiff such compensation as they shall think proper.

To take an oath. SEC. 10. *And be it enacted,* That the Commissioners and all other officers of the corporation, including judges of election, shall, before entering upon the duties of their respective offices, make oath that they will diligently and faithfully to the best of their abilities, skill and judgment, perform their duties of office, and shall file a certificate of the same among the records of the corporation.
