LAWS OF MARYLAND.

Bureau of Immigration. Chapter 57 of the Acts of 1896; to the Bureau of Immigration, the sum of ten thousand dollars, to be used in accordance with Chapter 295 of the Acts of 1896 and Chapter 282 of the Acts of 1898; to the Board of State Aid and Charities, the sum of two thousand one hundred dollars, to be used in accordance with Chapter 679 of the Acts of 1900; for repairs to Executive Mansion, the sum of five thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary.

Repairs to Executive Mansion.

PUBLIC DEBT.

Interest on public debt of the State.

For the payment of the interest on the public debt of the State, two hundred and seventy-five thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary.

Treasurer of the State to disburse all sums. SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That the Treasurer of the State, on the warrant of the Comptroller, shall disburse the said sum or sums of money herein appropriated for the objects and purposes herein specified, to or upon the order of the person or persons, or body politic or corporate, entitled to receive the same.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from and after the first day of October, 1905.

CHAPTER 682.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Sections 152 and 153 of Article 33 of the Public General Laws, title "Elections," sub-title "Primary Elections," as enacted by Chapter 296 of the Acts of 1902.

Primary elections.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Sections 152 and 153 of Article 33 of the Public General Laws, title "Elections," sub-title "Primary Elections," be and the same are hereby repealed and re-enacted so as severally to read as follows:

Nominations by political parties. 152. Political parties which, at the general election held on November 3, 1903, polled ten per cent. of the entire vote cast in the State, shall hereafter nominate their candidates for public office, and shall elect all delegates to conventions, or managing bodies in said political parties, and all precinct, ward, city and county executives or executive committees, not appointed by party conventions, whenever the political party
