

WHEREAS, The United Shirt and Collar Company is a non-resident corporation maintaining an office in the City of Baltimore solely and exclusively for the sale of articles manufactured by it; and

United Shirt and Collar Company.

WHEREAS, Under a law said corporation is not required to pay any license for the privilege of doing business; and

Not required to pay license to do business.

WHEREAS, During the years from 1890 to 1902, inclusive, the said United Shirt and Collar Company erroneously paid into the office of the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas of the City of Baltimore the sum of four hundred and twenty-nine dollars and thirty cents as a license for doing business in said city, which said sum was conveyed into the Treasury of the State of Maryland by the said Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas of Baltimore City; therefore,

Erroneously paid in moneys for license.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Comptroller of the State be and he is hereby authorized to draw his warrant upon the Treasurer of the State of Maryland, in favor of the said United Shirt and Collar Company, for the sum of four hundred and twenty-nine dollars and thirty cents, erroneously paid by them into the State Treasury through the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas of Baltimore City; and the said sum of four hundred and twenty-nine dollars and thirty cents be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the hands of the Treasurer of Maryland not otherwise appropriated for the purpose of meeting said warrant.

State Comptroller authorized to refund same.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 690.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 48 of Article 43 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Health," sub-title "Practitioners of Medicine," as repealed and re-enacted by Chapter 612 of the Acts of 1902.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Section 48 of Article 43 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Health," sub-title "Practitioners of Medicine," as repealed and re-enacted by Chapter 612 of the Acts of 1902, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, so as to read as follows:

Practitioners of Medicine.
