WHEREAS, The United Shirt and Collar Company is a non-united Shirt resident corporation maintaining an office in the City of Balti- and collar more solely and exclusively for the sale of articles manufactured by it; and

WHEREAS, Under a law said corporation is not required to pay any license for the privilege of doing business; and

WHEREAS, During the years from 1890 to 1902, inclusive, Erroneously the said United Shirt and Collar Company erroneously paid paid in into the office of the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas moneys for license. of the City of Baltimore the sum of four hundred and twentynine dollars and thirty cents as a license for doing business in said city, which said sum was conveved into the Treasury of the State of Maryland by the said Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas of Baltimore City: therefore,

SECTION I. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Mary-State Compland, That the Comptroller of the State be and he is hereby troller authorized to refund authorized to draw his warrant upon the Treasurer of the same. State of Maryland, in favor of the said United Shirt and Collar Company, for the sum of four hundred and twenty-nine dollars and thirty cents, erroneously paid by them into the State Treasury through the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas of Baltimore City; and the said sum of four hundred and twenty-nine dollars and thirty cents be and the same is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the hands of the Treasurer of Maryland not otherwise appropriated for the purpose of meeting said warrant.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
