leases and deeds made by various persons to and for the use and benefit of sundry ministerial persons, religious corporations, educational institutions, denominations or sects, and to certain charitable institutions hereinafter named.

Sanction given to sundry gifts, bequests, etc., to religious and educational corporations, etc.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the sanction and consent of said General Assembly of Maryland be and the same is hereby declared, given and granted to the following gifts, bequests, devises, grants, sales, leases, conveyances and deeds, to and from certain persons and bodies corporate, to and for the use of certain ministerial persons, religious and educational corporations, orders, denominations or sects, and to certain charitable institutions, as herein set forth.

Henshaw memorial Church of Baltimore.

1. To the bequest of five thousand dollars contained in the last will and testament of Elizabeth W. Aldrich, late of New York City, of the State of New York, deceased, to the rector, church wardens and vestrymen of the Henshaw Memorial Church of Baltimore, Maryland, as an endowment fund.

Evangelical Lutheran Church Zion of Middletown, Md.

2. To the bequest of one hundred dollars contained in the last will and testament of John Ringal, late of Frederick County, deceased, to the Council of the Evangelical Lutheran Church Zion, of Middletown, Frederick County, Maryland; said will bearing date of February 14, 1903, and recorded in Liber C. E. S., No. 1, folio 523, etc., of the will records of Frederick County.

Reformed Church at Wolfsville, Md.

3. To the sum of fifty dollars contained in the last will and testament of Daniel Wolf, late of Frederick County, deceased, to the Reformed Church at Wolfsville, Frederick County, Maryland; said will bearing date January 27, 1904, and recorded in Liber C. E. S., No. 1, folio 541, one of the will records of Frederick County.

To a Roman Catholic Church in Germany.

4. To the following bequests contained in the last will and testament and codicils thereto of Louisa Brack, of the City of Baltimore, deceased, to wit.: (a) A bequest of five thousand dollars to the resident pastor of Saints Phillip and James' Church (Roman Catholic), in Geisa, Sachsem Weimar, Germany. (b) A bequest of five thousand dollars to the Little Sisters of the Poor, of Baltimore City. (c) A bequest of three hundred dollars to the Oblate Sisters of Providence, of Baltimore City, known as "The Colored Sisters." (d) A bequest of one thousand dollars to St. Joseph's German Hospital, of Baltimore City. (e) A bequest of one thousand
