To a deed for certain real estate therein mentioned from Peter Ainslie to the "Third Congregation of the Disciples of Jesus Christ," in the city and precincts of Baltimore, a body corporate, said deed bearing date November 12, 1903, and recorded among the land records of Baltimore City, in Liber R. O., No. 2044, folio 457, etc.

Griffith, deceased, duly recorded, to wit: (a) A bequest of two thousand dollars to the First Reformed Church, of Baltimore City, located on Calvert street, near Read street, to be used for purpose as therein set forth. (b) A bequest of five hundred dollars to the "Industrial Home for Colored Girls," located at Melvale, Baltimore County, for the purposes as therein set forth. (c) A bequest of five hundred dollars to the Society for the Protection of Children from Cruelty and Immorality of Baltimore City, for purposes therein set forth. (d) A bequest of five thousand dollars and bookcase and books not otherwise disposed of to the Maryland Sunday-school Union for purposes therein set forth. (e) A bequest of four thousand dollars to the Maryland Prisoners' Aid Association, and bookcase and such of his books as pertain to prison matter, and all letters and documents pertaining to the work of said society, for the purposes therein set forth. (f) A bequest of five hundred dollars to Rev. George H. Nock, as therein set forth. (g) A bequest of a framed portrait of President Abraham Lincoln, which was received from the United States Christian Commission, to the Metropolitan Aid Association, of which Mr. Charles W. Wright is president.

76. To the following devise and bequest under the last will and testament of Elmar C. Thomas, late of Washington County, deceased, said will being recorded in the office of the Register of Wills for said county, to wit: (a) To the legacy of one hundred dollars to Barbara E. (b) To a legacy to the Convention of the Protestant Episcopal Church of the Diocese of Maryland, in trust, the proceeds of a note of eighteen hundred dollars, dated May 1, 1895, against Daniel B. Henderson, of Kansas City, Mo. (c) To a legacy of two hundred dollars from money invested in Iowa by Mr. Henry W. Smith, to be invested and the proceeds only used for the benefit of St. Thomas' Episcopal Church, at Hancock, Washington County, Maryland. (d) To a legacy of two hundred dollars for the benefit of the mission of the Protestant Episcopal Church at Millstone, Washington County, Maryland.
