

## LAWS OF MARYLAND.

77. To a legacy of two hundred dollars, under the last will and testament of Jacob W. Clair, late of Washington County, deceased, said will being recorded in the office of the Register of Wills for said county, to the trustees of Evangelical Church, of Cearfoss, Maryland, for the purposes therein set forth; also ten shares of stock of the Williamsport and Greencastle Turnpike Company in trust to said trustees for the purposes herein set forth.

78. To the following devise and bequest, under the last will and testament of Ellen Stuart, late of Washington County, deceased, said will being recorded in Register of Wills' office for Washington County, Maryland, to wit: (a) A devise of certain real estate in Baltimore City, known as 806 North Broadway, to the Little Sisters of the Poor, in Baltimore, Maryland. (b) To a bequest of all the money in the bank of the Central Savings Bank, in Baltimore, Maryland, or any other bank that may have deposits to the credit of said testator in the City of Baltimore, to the St. Joseph's Hospital, or to the trustees or board of managers for the benefit of said hospital.

79. To the following bequests, under the last will and testament of Alexander Newcomer, late of Washington County, deceased, said will being recorded in the office of the Register of Wills for Washington County, Maryland, to wit: (a) To a legacy of one thousand dollars to Walter S. Hayne, president of the educational board of the Association of Christians known as the Maryland, Delaware and District of Columbia, engaged in home missions, upon the conditions as set forth in said will. (b) To a legacy of four thousand dollars, to be deposited in and held in trust by the Safe Deposit and Trust Company of Baltimore, the interest to be paid annually as follows: One-fourth of net income to Henry Hill as long as he lives; one-fourth to Kate Marsh as long as she lives; one-fourth to Peter Ainslie, president of the board of trustees of the House for Working Girls, and in case that Peter Ainslie should cease to be president of the board, then interest to be paid to existing president; one-fourth to the trustees or their treasurer of the Christian Church at Beaver Creek, Washington County, Maryland, for the benefit of the poor members of the church, left entirely to the discretion of the elders of the church for distribution; trust to stand twenty years. And in case of death of Henry Hill, his one-fourth to be paid to Kate Marsh as long as she lives, and in case of death of Kate Marsh, the interest to be divided equally between the House for Working Girls and the trustees of the Christian Church, and at expiration of
