

to the Burgess and Councilmen and as often as required by them the financial condition of the town, with an account of all money received and expended, with the proper vouchers, which report may be published in a county newspaper; said account shall at all times be open for the inspection of any voters in said corporation.

SEC. 8. *And be it enacted*, That the Burgess, in virtue of this office, shall have and exercise all the powers of a Justice of the Peace, and be entitled to the same fees. Burgess to have powers of a justice of the peace.

SEC. 9. *And be it enacted*, That the Burgess and Councilmen may enact ordinances for the following purposes, to wit: To open new streets and close, straighten and grade streets; to grade, level and repair sidewalks; construct causeway; may adopt and provide efficient system of drainage to maintain its cleanliness and preserve the health of the town; to suppress and remove all nuisances and obstructions; to inspect all stables, pens, factories and other places detrimental to health; to regulate and keep in repair, streets, lanes and alleys; to restrain and prohibit gaming; to provide for licensing theatrical or other public exhibitions or amusements within the town; for the prevention and extinguishing of fires and to purchase and keep in repair and preservation a fire engine and apparatus, and to provide for the establishment and maintenance of fire and water departments; to license or tax dogs within the corporate limits of Myersville; to suppress drunkenness, vice and immorality; to provide for the maintenance of order and quiet around and upon church property; to punish by fines breaches of the peace, and preserve the peace, order and quiet of the town; to assess the property within said taxable limits, and to levy and collect taxes thereon necessary to carry into effect the ordinances of the town, said tax not to exceed one dollar on the one thousand dollars; to provide licensing any peddler, huckster or any person trading or selling any produce, live stock or merchandise on the streets of said town; to tax all telephone, telegraph and railroad poles fifty cents per annum. To-enact ordinances.

SEC. 10. *And be it enacted*, That they shall cause the footway to be paved and repaired at the expense of the owners of lots with building thereon whenever they may direct such work to be done, and shall direct how and of what materials the same shall be paved or repaired.
