Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 125.

AN ACT to authorize and empower the Mayor and Common Council of Hyattsville to establish, construct and maintain a sewerage system for the town to Hyattsville, Prince George's County, and to issue and sell its bonds to the amount of not exceeding \$30,000. To provide funds for that purpose and to provide for the payment of the principal and interest thereof, and to repeal only for the purpose of this Act, Sections 18 and 35 of Chapter 631 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, 1902, and all Acts and parts of Acts relating to the Mayor and Common Council of Hyattsville as far as the same are in conflict with this Act.

Establishing and maintaining a sewerage system.

rights and powers.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Mayor and Common Council of Hyattsville be and it is hereby fully authorized and empowered to construct, establish and maintain in working order a sewerage system in the town of Hyattsville for the collection, transmission and disposal of drainage and sewerage from the houses and other buildings, and cess-pools, wells, sinks and other receptacles for sewerage, drainage, &c., in said town; including also, if the said Mayor and Common Council shall at any time so determine, storm water and other drainage from the streets, lanes, roads and alleys thereof, and that the Municipality's Mayor and Common Council of Hyattsville shall have power to determine when and where, and in what order, and under what streets, roads, lanes and alleys the sewers and drains shall be constructed or laid, and to make contracts for the construction thereof, and shall have all powers necessary or appropriate for said purposes and for the accomplishment of the objects thereof.

To acquire by lease, purchase, etc.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted. That the Mayor and Common Council of Hyattsville shall have full power and authority to acquire by purchase, lease, gift or devise, or by condemnation in the manner prescribed in Sections 248 to 254, inclusive, of Article 23 of the Code of Public General Laws
