

Additional appropriation to build new school houses.

County be and it is hereby authorized and empowered to appropriate and pay over to the Board of County School Commissioners of Worcester County, out of the permanent free school fund of said county, eight thousand dollars, in addition to the sums of money heretofore authorized to be so appropriated out of said funds, to be used by said Board of County School Commissioners in building and repairing school houses in said county.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall not repeal Chapter 220 of the Acts passed at the January Session, 1894; but all other Acts or parts of Acts inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 168.

AN ACT to prevent the killing or trapping of foxes in Kent County.

Unlawful to kill foxes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That it shall not be lawful to injure or kill any fox in Kent County when pursued by dogs.

Forbidding the sale or barter of a fox.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That it shall not be lawful to shoot or trap foxes in Kent County for the purpose of selling or bartering.

One-half of the fine to go to the county school fund.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That any person or persons guilty of violating the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof before some justice of the peace of said county shall pay a fine of ten dollars, one-half of which shall go to the informer and the other half into the school fund of said county, and in default of the payment of said fine, shall be confined in the county jail for a term of not less than five or more than twenty days.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
