tion, and may, after purchasing, sell the same in such manner and on such terms as the board of directors of the said bank may determine; may purchase and hold, or sell, real or personal estate and property, and generally may do and transact a general banking business.

SEC. 7. And be it enacted, That the Stevensville Savings Bank of Queen Anne's County is hereby authorized to receive Authority to on deposit money or moneys, checks and commercial paper money, paper, from any corporation, joint stock company, copartnership, individual or administrator, guardian, receiver, assignee, trustee or any public officer of Queen Anne's County or elsewhere, other than the County Treasurer of said county, and from any person or persons acting for others, having the custody of any money belonging to themselves or held in trust or for others.

SEC. 8. And be it enacted, That whenever any deposits shall be made by a minor or married woman, such deposits shall be married received or held and paid out on precisely the same terms and woman's conditions as those of adult male or adult female depositors, and the check, receipt or acquittance of such minor or married woman shall be valid and binding on them, any law of this State to the contrary notwithstanding.

## CHAPTER 219.

AN ACT to repeal Sections 35 to 56, inclusive. of Article 22 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Washington County," sub-title "Boonsborough," and to re-enact the same with amendments and to add additional sections thereto in amending and revising the charter of Boonsborough.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Sections 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, 43, 44, 45, 46, 47, 48, 49, 50, 51, 52, 53, 54, 55 and 56 of Article 22 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland, title "Washington County," sub-title "Boonsborough," be and the same are hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

35. The inhabitants of Boonsborough, in Washington County, are created a corporation by the name of the Burgess
