

The court's order in the premises to the executor or administrator.

so decreed by the Orphans' Court within thirty days from the time of such decree, the court shall order and direct the executor or administrator to sell all the right, title and interest of such party in and to said estate or property, or so much thereof as the court may deem necessary, to pay his proportion of said tax and all expenses of sale; provided, however, that nothing in this section contained shall be construed to confer authority on the Orphans' Court to order the sale for the satisfaction of Collateral Inheritance Tax of any life interest after the expiration of four years from the date of the death of the decedent, who shall have died seized and possessed of the property, or of any remainder or revisionary interest after the expiration of four years from the date at which such interest shall vest in possession.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall be retroactive in its operation and shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 223.

AN ACT to repeal Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 of Chapter 195 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of 1896, entitled "An Act to enable the legal voters of Wicomico County, or any election district or town or city of said county, to determine, by election, whether or not fermented, spirituous or intoxicating liquors shall be sold in the said county or in any election district, town or city of said county," and to enact six sections in lieu thereof, to be known as Sections 1A, 2, 3, 4, 4A and 4B to provide for a special election to determine said question in Salisbury Election District No. 9 and Delmar Election District No. 11 of said county, and to add an additional section to be called Section 18, prohibiting the sale of liquor in certain other districts of said county.
